<b>Psalm 91 NKJV</b>	<b>Psalm 91 CEB</b>
<b>Safety of Abiding in the Presence of God</b>	
<p>He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High          Shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.  <sup>2</sup> I will say of the Lord, "He is my refuge and my          fortress; My God, in Him I will trust."  <sup>3</sup> Surely He shall deliver you from the snare of          the <sup>[a]</sup>fowler <i>And</i> from the perilous pestilence.  <sup>4</sup> He shall cover you with His feathers,          And under His wings you shall take refuge;          His truth <i>shall be your</i> shield and <sup>[b]</sup>buckler<small>[small shield]</small>.  <sup>5</sup> You shall not be afraid of the terror by night,  <i>Nor</i> of the arrow <i>that</i> flies by day,  <sup>6</sup> <i>Nor</i> of the pestilence <i>that</i> walks in darkness,  <i>Nor</i> of the destruction <i>that</i> lays waste at noonday.  <sup>7</sup> A thousand may fall at your side, And ten thousand at          your right hand; <i>But</i> it shall not come near you.  <sup>8</sup> Only with your eyes shall you look,          And see the reward of the wicked.  <sup>9</sup> Because you have made the Lord, <i>who is</i> my refuge,  <i>Even</i> the Most High, your dwelling place,  <sup>10</sup> No evil shall befall you,          Nor shall any plague come near your dwelling;  <sup>11</sup> <b>For He shall give His angels charge over you, To          keep you in all your ways.</b>  <sup>12</sup> In <i>their</i> hands they shall bear<sup>[lift]</sup> you up,          Lest you dash<sup>[strike]</sup> your foot against a stone.  <sup>13</sup> You shall tread upon the lion and the cobra,          The young lion and the serpent you shall trample          underfoot.  <sup>14</sup> "Because he has set his love upon Me, therefore I will          deliver him; I will <sup>[e]</sup>set<sup>[exalt]</sup> him on high, because he          has known My name.  <sup>15</sup> He shall call upon Me, and I will answer him;          I <i>will be</i> with him in trouble; I will deliver him and          honor him.  <sup>16</sup> With <sup>[f]</sup>long <sup>[length of days]</sup>life I will satisfy him, And          show him My salvation."</p>	<p>Living in the Most High's shelter,          camping in the Almighty's<sup>[a]</sup> shade,  <sup>2</sup> I say to the Lord, "You are my refuge, my          stronghold!          You are my God—the one I trust!"  <sup>3</sup> God will save you from the hunter's trap          and from deadly sickness.  <sup>4</sup> God will protect you with his pinions;          you'll find refuge under his wings.          His faithfulness is a protective shield.  <sup>5</sup> Don't be afraid of terrors at night,          arrows that fly in daylight,  <sup>6</sup> or sickness that prowls in the dark,          destruction that ravages at noontime.  <sup>7</sup> Even if one thousand people fall dead next to          you, ten thousand right beside you—          it won't happen to you.  <sup>8</sup> Just look with your eyes,          and you will see the wicked punished.  <sup>9</sup> Because you've made the Lord my refuge,          the Most High, your place of residence—  <sup>10</sup> no evil will happen to you;          no disease will come close to your tent.  <sup>11</sup> <b>Because he will order his messengers to help          you,</b> to protect you wherever you go.  <sup>12</sup> They will carry you with their own hands          so you don't bruise your foot on a stone.  <sup>13</sup> You'll march on top of lions and vipers;          you'll trample young lions and serpents          underfoot.  <sup>14</sup> God says, <sup>[b]</sup> "Because you are devoted to me,          I'll rescue you. I'll protect you because you know          my name.  <sup>15</sup> Whenever you cry out to me, I'll answer.          I'll be with you in troubling times. I'll save you and          glorify you.</p>
