### Vindication:

noun: vindication; plural noun: vindications

1. the action of clearing someone of blame or [suspicion](#).
  - o proof that someone or something is right, reasonable, or [justified](#).  
"the results were interpreted as vindication of the company's policy"

### Imprecatory: *noun*

- the act of calling down a curse(cursing) that invokes evil (and usually serves as an insult) “he suffered the imprecations of the mob” synonyms: malediction. condemnation, curse, execration. an appeal to some supernatural power to inflict evil on someone or some group.
- Imprecatory Psalms, contained within the Book of Psalms of the Hebrew Bible (Hebrew: תנ"ך), are those that imprecate – invoke judgment, calamity or curses upon one's enemies or those perceived as the enemies of God.

### Retribution: retrə'byōōSH(ə)n/

*noun*

1. punishment [inflicted](#) on someone as [vengeance](#) for a wrong or criminal act.

35 Plead <sup>[a]</sup> <i>my cause</i> , O Lord, with those who strive with me; Fight against those who fight against me. 2 Take hold of shield and <sup>[b]</sup> buckler, And stand up for my help. 3 Also draw out the spear, And stop those who pursue me. 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<sup>16</sup> With ungodly mockers at feasts  
They gnashed at me with their teeth.  
<sup>17</sup> Lord, how long will You <sup>(L)</sup>look on?  
Rescue me from their destructions,  
My precious *life* from the lions.  
<sup>18</sup> I will give You thanks in the great assembly;  
I will praise You among <sup>(h)</sup>many people.  
<sup>19</sup> <sup>(L)</sup>Let them not rejoice over me who are wrongfully  
my enemies;  
Nor let them wink with the eye who hate me without  
a cause.  
<sup>20</sup> For they do not speak peace,  
But they devise deceitful matters  
Against *the* quiet ones in the land.  
<sup>21</sup> They also opened their mouth wide against me,  
*And* said, "Aha, aha!  
Our eyes have seen *it*."  
<sup>22</sup> *This* You have seen, O Lord;  
Do not keep silence.  
O Lord, do not be far from me.  
<sup>23</sup> Stir up Yourself, and awake to my vindication,  
To my cause, my God and my Lord.  
<sup>24</sup> Vindicate me, O Lord my God, according to Your  
righteousness;  
And let them not rejoice over me.  
<sup>25</sup> Let them not say in their hearts, "Ah, so we would  
have *it*!"  
Let them not say, "We have swallowed him up."  
<sup>26</sup> Let them be ashamed and brought to mutual  
confusion  
Who rejoice at my hurt;  
Let them be <sup>(M)</sup>clothed with shame and dishonor  
Who exalt themselves against me.  
<sup>27</sup> <sup>(N)</sup>Let them shout for joy and be glad,  
Who favor my righteous cause;  
And let them say continually,  
"Let the Lord be magnified,  
Who has pleasure in the prosperity of His servant."  
<sup>28</sup> And my tongue shall speak of Your righteousness  
*And* of Your praise all the day long.

<sup>15</sup> But when I stumbled, they celebrated and gathered  
together— they gathered together against me!  
Strangers<sup>(d)</sup> I didn't know tore me to pieces and  
wouldn't quit.  
<sup>16</sup> They ridiculed me over and over again, like godless  
people would do, grinding their teeth at me.  
<sup>17</sup> How long, my Lord, will you watch this happen?  
Rescue me from their attacks; rescue my precious life  
from these predatory lions!  
<sup>18</sup> Then I will thank you in the great assembly;  
I will praise you in a huge crowd of people.  
<sup>19</sup> Don't let those who are my enemies without cause  
celebrate over me; don't let those who hate me for no  
reason wink at my demise.  
<sup>20</sup> They don't speak the truth;  
instead, they plot false accusations against innocent  
people in the land.  
<sup>21</sup> They speak out against me, saying, "Yes! Oh, yes!  
We've seen it with our own eyes!"  
<sup>22</sup> But you've seen it too, Lord. Don't keep quiet about it.  
Please don't be far from me, my Lord.  
<sup>23</sup> Wake up! Get up and do justice for me;  
argue my case, my Lord and my God!  
<sup>24</sup> Establish justice for me  
according to your righteousness, Lord, my God.  
Don't let them celebrate over me.  
<sup>25</sup> Don't let them say to themselves,  
Yes! Exactly what we wanted!  
Don't let them say, "We ate him up!"  
<sup>26</sup> Let all those who celebrate my misfortune be  
disgraced and put to shame!  
Let those who exalt themselves over me  
be dressed up in shame and dishonor!  
<sup>27</sup> But let those who want things to be set right for me  
shout for joy and celebrate!  
Let them constantly say, "The Lord is great—  
God wants his servant to be at peace."  
<sup>28</sup> Then my tongue will talk  
all about your righteousness;  
it will talk  
about your praise all day long.

**MATTHEW 23 NKJV**

**Woe to the Scribes and Pharisees<sup>(A)</sup>**

<sup>23</sup> Then Jesus spoke to the multitudes and to His disciples, <sup>2</sup> saying: <sup>(B)</sup>“The scribes and the Pharisees sit in Moses’ seat.<sup>3</sup> Therefore whatever they tell you <sup>(a)</sup>to observe, *that* observe and do, but do not do according to their works; for <sup>(C)</sup>they say, and do not do. <sup>4</sup> <sup>(D)</sup>For they bind heavy burdens, hard to bear, and lay *them* on men’s shoulders; but they *themselves* will not move them with one of their fingers. <sup>5</sup> But all their works they do to <sup>(E)</sup>be seen by men. They make their phylacteries broad and enlarge the borders of their garments. <sup>6</sup> <sup>(F)</sup>They love the <sup>(b)</sup>best places at feasts, the best seats in the synagogues,<sup>7</sup> greetings in the marketplaces, and to be called by men, ‘Rabbi, Rabbi.’ <sup>8</sup> <sup>(G)</sup>But you, do not be called ‘Rabbi’; for One is your <sup>(c)</sup>Teacher, <sup>(d)</sup>the Christ, and you are all brethren. <sup>9</sup> Do not call anyone on earth your father; <sup>(H)</sup>for One is your Father, He who is in heaven. <sup>10</sup> And do not be called teachers; for One is your Teacher, the Christ. <sup>11</sup> But <sup>(I)</sup>he who is greatest among you shall be your servant. <sup>12</sup> <sup>(J)</sup>And whoever exalts himself will be <sup>(e)</sup>humbled, and he who humbles himself will be <sup>(f)</sup>exalted.

<sup>13</sup> “But <sup>(K)</sup>woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you shut up the kingdom of heaven against men; for you neither go in *yourselves*, nor do you allow those who are entering to go in. <sup>14</sup> <sup>(L)</sup>Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! <sup>(M)</sup>For you devour widows’ houses, and for a pretense make long prayers. Therefore, you will receive greater condemnation.

<sup>15</sup> “Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you travel land and sea to win one proselyte, and when he is won, you make him twice as much a son of <sup>(h)</sup>hell as yourselves.

<sup>16</sup> “Woe to you, <sup>(N)</sup>blind guides, who say, <sup>(O)</sup>‘Whoever swears by the temple, it is nothing; but whoever swears by the gold of the temple, he is obliged *to perform it.*’ <sup>17</sup> Fools and blind! For which is greater, the gold <sup>(P)</sup>or the temple that <sup>(i)</sup>sanctifies the gold? <sup>18</sup> And, ‘Whoever swears by the altar, it is nothing; but whoever swears by the gift that is on it, he is obliged *to perform it.*’ <sup>19</sup> Fools and blind! For which is greater, the gift <sup>(Q)</sup>or the altar that sanctifies the gift? <sup>20</sup> Therefore he who <sup>(j)</sup>swears by the altar, swears by it and by all things on it. <sup>21</sup> He who swears by the temple, swears by it and by <sup>(R)</sup>Him who <sup>(k)</sup>dwells in it. <sup>22</sup> And he who swears by heaven, swears by <sup>(S)</sup>the throne of God and by Him who sits on it.

<sup>23</sup> “Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! <sup>(T)</sup>For you pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin, and <sup>(U)</sup>have neglected the weightier *matters* of the law: justice and mercy and faith. These you ought to have done, without leaving the others undone. <sup>24</sup> Blind guides, who strain out a gnat and swallow a camel!

<sup>25</sup> “Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! <sup>(V)</sup>For you cleanse the outside of the cup and dish, but inside they are full of extortion and <sup>(W)</sup>self-indulgence. <sup>26</sup> Blind Pharisee, first cleanse the inside of the cup and dish, that the outside of them may be clean also.





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<sup>27</sup> "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! <sup>(W)</sup>For you are like whitewashed tombs which indeed appear beautiful outwardly, but inside are full of dead *men's* bones and all uncleanness. <sup>28</sup> Even so you also outwardly appear righteous to men, but inside you are full of hypocrisy and lawlessness.

<sup>29</sup> <sup>(W)</sup>"Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! Because you build the tombs of the prophets and <sup>(m)</sup>adorn the monuments of the righteous, <sup>30</sup> and say, 'If we had lived in the days of our fathers, we would not have been partakers with them in the blood of the prophets.'

<sup>31</sup> "Therefore you are witnesses against yourselves that <sup>(X)</sup>you are sons of those who murdered the prophets. <sup>32</sup> <sup>(Y)</sup>Fill up, then, the measure of your fathers' *guilt*. <sup>33</sup> Serpents, <sup>(Z)</sup>brood<sup>(n)</sup> of vipers! How can you escape the condemnation of hell?<sup>34</sup> <sup>(AA)</sup>Therefore, indeed, I send you prophets, wise men, and scribes: <sup>(AB)</sup>some of them you will kill and crucify, and <sup>(AC)</sup>some of them you will scourge in your synagogues and persecute from city to city, <sup>35</sup> <sup>(AD)</sup>that on you may come all the righteous blood shed on the earth, <sup>(AE)</sup>from the blood of righteous Abel to <sup>(AF)</sup>the blood of Zechariah, son of Berechiah, whom you murdered between the temple and the altar. <sup>36</sup> Assuredly, I say to you, all these things will come upon this generation.

**Jesus Laments over Jerusalem<sup>(AG)</sup>**

<sup>37</sup> <sup>(AH)</sup>"O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the one who kills the prophets<sup>(AI)</sup> and stones those who are sent to her! How often <sup>(AJ)</sup>I wanted to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks<sup>(AK)</sup> under *her* wings, but you were not willing! <sup>38</sup> See! Your house is left to you desolate; <sup>39</sup> for I say to you, you shall see Me no more till you say, <sup>(AL)</sup>'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!' "

**MT 23 CEB Ways of the legal experts and the Pharisees**

23 Then Jesus spoke to the crowds and his disciples, <sup>2</sup> "The legal experts and the Pharisees sit on Moses' seat. <sup>3</sup> Therefore, you must take care to do everything they say. But don't do what they do. <sup>4</sup> For they tie together heavy packs that are impossible to carry. They put them on the shoulders of others, but are unwilling to lift a finger to move them. <sup>5</sup> Everything they do, they do to be noticed by others. They make extra-wide prayer bands for their arms and long tassels for their clothes. <sup>6</sup> They love to sit in places of honor at banquets and in the synagogues. <sup>7</sup> They love to be greeted with honor in the markets and to be addressed as 'Rabbi.' <sup>8</sup> "But you shouldn't be called *Rabbi*, because you have one teacher, and all of you are brothers and sisters. <sup>9</sup> Don't call anybody on earth your father, because you have one Father, who is heavenly. <sup>10</sup> Don't be called *teacher*, because Christ is your one teacher. <sup>11</sup> But the one who is greatest among you will be your servant. <sup>12</sup> All who lift themselves up will be brought low. But all who make themselves low will be lifted up.

All the way to its foundations!" they yelled.  <sup>8</sup> Daughter Babylon, you destroyer, <sup>(a)</sup> a blessing on the one who pays you back the very deed you did to us!  <sup>9</sup> A blessing on the one who seizes your children and smashes them against the rock!</p>	

God had spoken through his prophet Samuel to both Saul and David. Saul had disobeyed the word that had come to him,<sup>302</sup> and had refused to recognize the word that had come to David. That was why he was rejected. Perhaps it was because of the scruples which stopped David from killing Saul, when he twice had the opportunity, that the psalm never names an individual, but always speaks of enemies in the plural, and anonymously. It is nevertheless with Saul's downfall that David's prayer is answered, and the cause of his doom, spelt out for him by the spirit of the dead Samuel, is exactly what lies behind every imprecation in Scripture: 'Because you did not obey the LORD ... the LORD has done this to you.' **Not one disobedience, nor two, but a whole mindset which has turned against God, an inexorable wilful march to ruin.** *Wilcock, M.
